Library Innovates to Protect Healthcare Workers

Your financial support allowed the Library Foundation to launch and fund a partnership to use Library 3D printers to produce critically needed safety shields. Public Technology Services Librarian Catherine Hoang and her team are producing more than 300 face shields per week for frontline workers at Scripps Health, Kaiser Permanente, and Operation Shelter to Home at the Convention Center. Because the virus knows no borders, Library staff also will supply 1,000 face shields to Tijuana healthcare workers. Your past support helped the Library Foundation outfit the Library's IDEA Labs with 3D printers. You have helped ignite a passion for science and technology in young people who never would have considered a future in these fields. Through a UC San Diego partnership, the Library Foundation helps fund access to free STEAM education, college preparation and workforce development training. With workshops at every Library location, Sally Ride Science has taught over 6,000 students to build robots, create 3D graphics and program computers. Program Your Future lets high school students earn college certificates in tech subjects and Admit One Academy helps students qualify for and apply for college. Library staff are continuing to provide these resources online.

Summer Reading

For 97 summers, the Library has fought "summer slide" and kept children engaged, learning and reading. Participating students score higher in reading achievement than peers who do not participate. The Library is taking this year's Summer Reading and Shiley Teen Summer Reading Programs online. Thanks to an Intuit partnership, the Library Foundation will challenge the community to read 200,000 books or hours. The Library Foundation also is sponsoring prizes to encourage children and teens to read.

Storytime, science experiments, SAT test prep, opera insights, legal advice on tenant rights and small business patent/trademark applications, and a How-to-Festival with steps for drawing Wonder Woman or sewing your own mask—this is a full calendar of Library events at any time. Yet it is even more impressive as Library staff stepped up to provide these valuable educational and informational programs over the past two months—all of which were offered online. And, due to your Library Foundation support, we're providing each branch with a new laptop to make online content production easier for Library staff.

On May 19th, we celebrated the San Diego Public Library's 138th anniversary of providing essential services to San Diegans. In 1882, the Library's founders sought to broaden access to information for San Diego's 2,600 citizens. One of San Diego's first librarians, Miss Lulu Younkin, organized the Library's books according to the Dewey Decimal System and penned the first catalogue in April 1889. Miss Younkin noted with pride, "The institution is now an honor to the public spirit, taste and culture of San Diego." Now, 138 years later, the Library continues to provide critical access to essential information and educational resources for millions each year. As San Diego begins to recover and reopen, Library resources will be more important than ever, particularly in the most impacted communities.
